## AN OPEN LETTER TO THE AMERICAN FEDERATION OF MUSICIANS

Dear AFM International Executive Board:

We are writing to express our disappointment in your recent decision to discontinue the option for AFM locals to extend membership dues deadlines. This instruction appears in a letter to all AFM locals, dated Dec. 14, 2020: "Any member that has not paid dues for six months must be expelled in conformity with AFM bylaws." We respectfully ask the IEB to reconsider this policy.

As you know, almost all professional musicians are out of work. Many have had difficulty keeping up their membership dues. Unfortunately, we feel your policy has the potential to damage our relationship with our members by putting us in the position of being "enforcers" or "debt collectors" during this unprecedented pandemic.

We respectfully request flexibility and help. Other national unions have recognized the great pressure and stress their locals are going through. They've offered credits and discounts to their locals on the per capita dues that they are required to remit.

To put it simply, most of our local unions are struggling financially, along with our own members. We rely on the good will of our musicians and the relationships with our members to survive.

We need your help to give our members a lifeline through this pandemic by simply extending a credit on per capita dues to locals until live performance starts to return and musicians go back to work.
